ASU GOLF OUTING:

St Andrew's College PPU golfers have retained the Association of Schools' Unions (ASU) Cup at the annual inter-school past pupils' golf competition, held this year on 10 July in Beech Park GC. Having won the competition in 2008, the win this year means that the PPU has now won this trophy on 14 occasions since the 1940's. An interesting fact is that in 1958 St Andrew's won the trophy for the third year in a row. Hopefully we can mirror that achievement in 2010!

This year past pupils from 9 schools competed for the cup. In this competition, any number of past pupils from each of the competing schools can enter and play. This year, as a result of a lot of hard work by our PPU golf secretary/manager, David Burnett, St Andrew's College PPU had 20 players representing the school. The competition is singles stableford format. Then the best 4 individual scores from each PPU team are aggregated and the Union with the highest aggregate score wins the cup.

This year the best St Andrew's scores were returned by:

David Burnett (handicap 20) with 39 points (also received 1st prize in class 2);

Bernard White (18) with 36 points (also received 4th prize in class 2);

Graham Hohn (8) with 35 points (also received 4th prize in class 1); and

Neville Hohn (12) with 33 points, giving St Andrew's PPU an aggregate score of 143 points.

Bob Tweedy, PPU President 2008/'09, was in attendance at the dinner to receive the cup on behalf of the PPU and thanked all the PPU golfers who had participated and indicated that he was delighted that the PPU had retained the trophy.

David Burnett said that he is hopeful that St Andrew's PPU can field an equally strong team in 2010 with an even greater number of "recent" school leavers in order to seek to "make it three wins in a row" for the second time in history.

"I was one of those precocious little brats that arrived at St Andrew's in Clyde Road in September 1971. I luckily avoided shorts on the first day, John Horsfield did not. I wore the quartered school cap - an error that was clawed back by using it as a class Frisbee.

Ronnie Hay and David Boyd were the new boys and didn't look much older than us. If my memory is right they, at the bottom of the land grab pecking order, got the stable block classrooms at the end of the playground just beside Speedy Wilson's chalk dust filled room. Newly white washed the "converted" stables were minimalist.

Mr Hay wore his gown with a certain confidence; I got the feeling that Mr Boyd wore his to differentiate him from the sixth formers. Hair was worn long in those days. Farah perma-pressed trousers and the obligatory Donegal Tweed jacket hid under their cloaks of authority. My recollection was that Mr Boyd's was neutral blue and grey and Mr Hay was neutral brown and green. Speedy was neutral chalk dust.

Excerpts from memories of Steven Ahern's Messrs Hay and Boyd were full of enthusiasm for education, marred only by 1A's complete lack of connection to their new world of big school. We had one or two junior borders that arrived with us and they knew the ropes - tuck shop, fag supply, vitriolic sixth formers and other essential guide notes to survival of the first week in Clyde Road.

> Mr Hay took no insubordination. He had certain intransigence about him and he seemed to keep emotion out of the teacher/pupil game. Compromise was not a place for Mr Hay. He was cool and consistent. At first glance he looked stern - his heavy brow exaggerated his authority. He taught me History. He did a great job."

The second poorest country in the Western Hemisphere is Nicaragua and that is where I ventured this year, also with UCDVO.

out a little. I held a charity dinner and raffle in my house, I did Sports massage in my Hockey club and I wrote to the PPU. The PPU were kind enough to give me a generous donation towards my trip to Nicaragua and thanks to all of the support plus the PPU's donation I

The projects that UCDVO undertook in Nicaragua this year were to build a basketball court, a tree house and a sewerage system at a school called 'Los Quinchos' for disadvantaged children at higher social risk. While there, we also painted a mural of a map of the world for the children. We landscaped the grounds at a Health Centre, which had been built last year by UCDVO, and constructed stoves in local houses.
